This is an outlandish revelation, one that makes me wonder if it is real. If so, then the world has taken yet another turn toward the Flesh, toward evil.

I wonder if it is age that makes a Christian think the world is increasingly carnal and godless? When younger we don't see the filth and grime morally which permeates politics, business, relationships, and sadly, too much the church as well. As we mature in faith we have our eyes opened to the wretched struggle with sin that all of us undergo. We also see the inventive ways the World keeps lust, greed and avarice fresh.

But, at a funeral? I hope there's a retraction of the story coming, but I fear perhaps not.
