TRY TO LOVE STATISTICS

Statistics are just numbers. Boring, right? Yes, they can be when it comes to the "crunching" part, but when it comes to the predictive power of numbers, they can be fascinating. It seems incredible that the Lord has given mankind such knowledge (Note, there is a great difference between knowledge and *wisdom*, as wisdom is a spiritually derived form of knowledge) so as to make computers, which allow us to develop the science of statistics. Statistics tell us such things as how fast a country is growing or declining, how long we might be expected to live, and what the odds are of a certain event taking place.

It is that last one, the probability of an event, that figures largely in my discussions on the topic of Origins. I love statistics because they *soundly refute Evolutionary Theory, to the point of showing that anyone who holds to it does so out of an emotional, not intellectual commitment.* Just today on Yahoo.com News I saw an article entitled, "Out of 700 Quintillion Other Planets, Earth Might Be Totally Unique". The unsuitability of other planets for life is not news to those who have been keeping up on the subject. In 2004 Guillermo Gonzalez and Jay W. Richards in their groundbreaking book <u>The Privileged Planet</u> showed through massive amounts of data that Earth is *unique* – not just rare, but utterly singular. The odds against another "Earth" out there are *beyond astronomical*.
