### "DESPECIATION"

According to evolutionary theory, accidents in the genes of creatures drive speciation, splitting of animals into similar, but eventually very dissimilar varieties. Never mind that DNA shows this is not happening; it's what Darwinists teach about development of life on earth. From the standpoint of atheism, it's working because the percentage of Americans who believe in the God of the Bible is the lowest ever.

Once in a while evolutionists use an opposite term, "despeciation". Yes, the term despeciation suggest that species of animals can in certain circumstances mate and in the process a distinct species can be lost. The reason this is important is because neither speciation, nor despeciation demonstrates animals morph into different kinds of animals. The convenient concept of despeciation allows Darwinists an escape hatch for the obvious error of speciation.

An example is in order; there are many species of fruit fly, for example, and they are technically different species by small but significant differences between them, despite still being fruit flies. The term "species" is applied with near microscopic detail to slice and dice animal kinds endlessly. Evolutionary theory says that animals and plants endlessly branch out to make different species and eventually radically different animals and plants. The idea is that the movement is in one direction, toward branching out and making additional species.

However, now a nice reversal trick has been added to the Darwinist's play book, allowing for suggestion that in certain circumstances two distinct species mate and one of the former is lost forever. In other words, when evolution doesn't act the way evolutionists claim, now they can say it was "despeciation" at work! Instead of seeing a reversal of the process they claim is universal as evidence they are wrong, they try to claim a parallel process is at work.

The sad part of all this is that none of this proves animals morph into different animals (morphology). Fruit flies will make fruit flies, and cows will make cows. Just because a very slightly different fly or cow is seen to mate with another in no way shows animals morph into different kinds of animals. Leave it to the Darwinists to muddy up science even further through providing a distinction without significance!

# DON'T MISTAKE BIBLICAL HEROES' FAITH FOR EXCITEMENT

We may be tempted to consider our lives boring compared to the Biblical heroes we wish to emulate. Be careful before you ask God to make your life more "exciting"! These heroes struggled against incredible enemies with the assurance that the Lord was with them. It is doubtful the saints of old wished for such tense, dangerous situations!
