LAWMAKER PUNISHED, AND SHOPLIFERS UNPUNISHED

BBC News reported that an Indonesian man who helped draft strict anti-adultery laws, which included the punishment of public flogging, shall we say, supported the establishment of such a law. He was caught having sex in a car with a married woman. Purportedly the caning (28 times for men, 23 for women), while painful is not as horrible as the shame it generates.

Meanwhile, a Fox News article about the consequences of California's Proposition 47 (which passed in 2014) has led to widespread looting and shoplifting, because shoplifting was reduced to a misdemeanor for incidents under \$950. Shoplifting rings spearheaded by Mexican gangs send persons with calculators in to steal up to the limit – repeatedly. Thieves know they can steal and likely not be punished. The idea behind the law was to allow police and the penal system to focus on violent crime. Consequently, what is now redefined as petty crime has exploded. Of the 20 largest cities in the U.S., San Francisco has the highest property crime rate.

The sick and twisted part of all this is that likely a majority of those above involved in various crimes in different cultures think of themselves as "basically good people". They excuse their behavior as something less than the result of pure evil within them. No one wants to face the fact that we are shot full of sin, corrupted in our desires, and continuously break society's and/or God's laws.

Fires are ravaging the California countryside, but I think the worse inferno is that the laws of the land, and the morality of God that stands behind them, are being torched. There are terrible consequences to society of such lawlessness; decency, security and peace are lost. I am reminded of the Old Testament prophet Hosea, who used an agricultural analogy, "They sow the wind and reap the whirlwind (8:7)." Take some time to read the entire chapter and you will see that Israel, the northern kingdom after the split after King Solomon, was apostate. They defied God's law, and the Lord told them there would be consequences, as they would, "... reap the whirlwind."

From neglect of worship of the Lord, to outright violation of his holy will, much less willful, repeated defiance of civil law, our culture is beginning to feel the cyclonic turning of horrid cultural change, the consequences of sowing the wind. It is not a tornado – yet. If there is not another Great Awakening, a true return to God, it will come, and it will be devastating beyond your comprehension.
