THE BLESSING OF BEING CAUGHT IN SIN

We tend to slide. Our sinful nature does not rest, does not allow us to float along blithefully in faith for very long before it once again tries to lure us into willful disobedience to God. Sin acts as a negative gravity pulling us down, that is, down and away from the heavenly things, the things that are of God, and toward things that are base, worldly, fleshly. Eventually, that slide ends up in a wreck of some sort, a major violation of the will of God.

If we are blessed, we will be caught. The sinful self does not want to be caught; you can always tell when someone is willfully sinning, because they will attempt to hide it. Persons involved in sin are typically not read to repent; they keep on with the wickedness, justifying it and/or marginalizing its impact. The violator may be causing great harm to themselves but will most often continue despite. It is not until the truth is exposed, the lie and sin revealed, that we finally confront how disgustingly unholy we have been.

I am reminded of David, who certainly was not a favorite of God for his flawless life. His life was far from flawless, marred by big time sins such as adultery and murder. One of the Lord's greatest blessings in love toward David was to have him caught in his sin. Had not the Lord sent the prophet Nathan to David to crush his ego and force repentance, I suspect David may have even fallen away from faith! Does that sound impossible, no chance that someone who is so fervent for God would do such a thing? If you think that is impossible, then you do not have a healthy fear of the power of sin to mislead people, nor recognition of the fact that we are in a spiritual war with Satan and the demons. Unless repented, sin is a spiritual cancer that will destroy faith. It must be aggressively repented and fought.

That is why it is a blessing to be caught and humbled when in open rebellion against the Lord. It is the mercy of God which has us confronted by other believers – ones who will not hypocritically condemn us (for they are sinners, too), but lovingly demand we repent and seek restoration with God and them. That can literally be a life saving activity! Humiliation from guilt is terribly painful, but not nearly as fatal as the wages of sin – death (see Romans 6:20-23)! As a loving Father, God does what is necessary to correct and discipline his children out of love. Those who hate God, who oppose Him, should expect nothing but retribution and damnation, unless they denounce their wickedness and repent. But Christians who are to represent Christ, but who at times are disobedient, should consider it a mercy of God that they are caught and forced to repent, thus halting their slide into utter depravity. We see in 2 Corinthians 7:10, "Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death." As we take our turn in failing the Lord and having to repent profusely, we learn the importance of those words.
