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## "IN THE WORLD, BUT NOT OF THE WORLD"

For many of us, this phrase was a platitude, a nice thought that required no personal struggle or sacrifice. Increasingly, it will require both. As I have said for decades, the paganizing of America is accelerating – actually, it's not only moving faster, it is precipitating, congealing into a social mess.

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Our Christian witness is extremely important now! Jesus used vivid analogies to highlight the contrast between believers and the world. Christ encourages us, "You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world (Matthew 5: 13a, 14a)." A Christian – that is, the Bible-based Christian as opposed to secularized, nominal Christian – has a fundamentally different worldview and lifestyle. We act and talk differently than secular persons. The Holy Spirit fills us to confess Jesus and resist worldliness, no matter the cost.

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The early Christians were not popular, but the Lord added to their number daily (see Acts 2:42-47). People who are tired of the burden of sin and who long for love will be drawn to Christ. We are the ones advertising Jesus to the world. We are to be tough on sin, but merciful, including giving of our time and money, to those who are hurting. This is a powerful inducement for them to become followers of Jesus!

### **FORGIVE YOU!**

Public discourse has become more coarse, evidenced by the frequency of the F-word. Whereas vulgarity has frowned upon by a largely Christian society generations ago, now it is commonplace. Christians are not to be worldly in their speech, "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen (Ephesians 4:29)."

In pharisaical form, there are believers who assiduously guard their mouths to show themselves to be godly. Meanwhile, they imbibe in the intellectual equivalent of recreational drugs as they uncritically absorb Evolutionary propaganda pumped out by the world. Talk about straining out a gnat and swallowing a camel! (see Matthew 23:23-24).

A gentleman named Harry and I have come up with a way to turn the world's grunge into a humorous positive form of expression. As we were discussing the topic of forgiveness, we considered it to be "the other F-word". We then mimicked an abusive demeanor as we harshly said, "Forgive you!" It was hilarious; we had found a great way to beat the world at their own game! I hope it spreads like wildfire, with Christians taking the world's trash and turning it into something good.

Christians are empowered to use God's forgiveness to absolve others. Peter, then all the Apostles were given instructions on how to forgive others (see Matthew 16:13-20; 18:15-20). The power of forgiveness is not limited to church leaders, but all believers in the New Testament are exhorted to forgive one another as God in Christ has forgiven them (see Colossians 3:12-17). You don't need to go to a priest, but the members of the church can receive the confession of sins, pray for such a person, and turn them from their sin (see James 5:13-20).

The next time someone makes a mistake and apologizes, adopt a mockingly angry posture and with a smirk, say, "Forgive you!"
